Childcare Training Pathway

t is possible to study childcare, from an introductory level to Level Three (equivalent to GCE Advanced Level) in Burngreave. Courses are delivered at a number of venues, including schools and the Vestry Hall.

- Play to Learn: Learn to Play: This is a course for people with no experience of childcare training. There are no entrance requirements. The course helps learners decide whether a career in childcare is for them and, if so, which type of childcare they wish to work in. It is also very useful for any parent. (6 weeks)
- NCFE Level One (12/14 weeks)
- NCFE Level Two (One year)
- NVQ Level Two (National Vocational Qualification) (One year)
- NVQ Level Three (One year)

Usually learners without previous qualifications will spend a year completing the Play to Learn course and the NCFE Level One, before going on to the NCFE or NVQ Level Two. The NVQ Level Three is the standard qualification for work in childcare.

The Adult Learning Working Group is working to improve the childcare pathway, including the development of a special ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) course for people wanting to study childcare. Learners will need, at least, the equivalent of an Entry Level Three qualification in English, to access the Level Two childcare courses.

An information and assessment day, for anyone wanting to start courses in childcare, in Burngreave, at any level, will be held in early Summer. There will be more details about the information and assessment day and about childcare courses, in general, in the next issue of the courses booklet.

Inspired To Learn



dults from a range of backgrounds from the local community recently completed a National Open College Network (NOCN) Word Processing qualification at the Burngreave Vestry Hall.

The course, which is provided and funded by the City Council's Lifelong Learning and Skills Service, runs in 10-week blocks and has approximately 20 hours of learning time. It is suitable for learners of varying experience, from complete beginners to those with more advanced skills.

Tutor Phil Youngman said: "These types of courses are ideal for adults and parents as you can fit them around your personal circumstances and they are an ideal way to gain additional skills.

"The facilities here at the Vestry Hall are fantastic with modern PC's and fully equipped offices – which are good for teaching and good to gain computer skills."

The course itself is taught on a stage by stage basis with complete beginners learning the very basics of how to create a document, save files and print documents. Those with more advanced skills can learn to create newsletters and scale drawings.

Said Guleid, a 37-year old former factory worker decided to start the course as he found most jobs that he was looking at required the use of computers – a skill that he did not really have. He said: "Since starting this course, I have not only increased my typing skills and speed but have also developed a better understanding of computers overall."

Said hopes to progress on to a computer related course at University in the future.

Another Learner, Yegin Gebrekidus, a 27-year old local resident also hopes to continue his studies in computers so he can gain employment in the Information Technology (IT) sector.

However, not all learners are taking the classes to increase their employability. Margaret Betts has completed a number of courses including Word Processing, Presentations, Email and Communication and Desk Top Publishing.

The 59-year old had previously worked in retail and had no experience of using computers before starting her courses. Margaret said: "I am doing the courses for myself and not to increase my job prospects as I am retiring next year.

"I really enjoy learning new skills and developing my abilities, especially in the exciting subject areas around computers. I also think the Vestry Hall is a fantastic learning venue for the local community."

The Burngreave Vestry Hall offers a number of adult learning courses including ESOL, Literacy, Numeracy and IT. New Start For Mr Din

Burngreave resident Mohammed Jangeer Din has just completed a two year employment training programme in the construction industry, which he started as a result of support from the *Apprenticeships for All* programme. The 36-year old has now gained employment with a large construction company in Sheffield.

Mohammed had previously worked as a bus driver and an industrial cleaner, but found himself unemployed without the prospects of a job in the near future. During this time Mohammed took part in a short course where he learned bricklaying skills, and discovered that it was an area of work he enjoyed and would like to pursue. However, given his long period of unemployment and lack of qualifications or work experience in the construction industry, it seemed unlikely that he would succeed on his own.

Mohammed had been a regular visitor to Forum House where he was receiving on-going support with looking for employment. He was referred to the *Apprenticeships for All* team where he expressed an interest in working in the construction industry. Following an initial appointment with an advisor, he was supported by *Apprenticeships for All* to apply for the Construction JOBMatch programme and after going through a panel interview, he was successful in gaining a place on the programme.

As a result of being on the programme Mohammed has gained an NVQ level 2 in Maintenance Operation, a level 2 Health and Safety certificate, a CSCS card, pasma certificate for scaffolding and Level 2 National Numeracy and Literacy certificates.

The opportunity presented to Mohammed through the *Apprenticeship* for *All* programme has really turned his life around, and the positive impact it has had on him is clear for everyone to see. Previously, Mohammed had personal problems and, on top of dealing with being unemployed for such a long time, had resulted in him struggling to cope and looking for ways to get through each day. Since being on the programme Mohammed has now been able to buy his house and he has had two children, for whom he now feels he has the opportunity to provide a better life.



Mohammed said: "Apprenticeships 4 All is a really good programme, it has given me the chance to learn new skills and get a job, which means I can now provide for my family."

Mohammed has also found that his relationships with family and friends have improved greatly since being supported onto the programme by *Apprenticeships for All*, and he knows that they are really proud of his achievements. In fact he has said that they all want to put his new skills to good use and frequently ask him to complete jobs for them!

Mohammed is now in full time employment with Wates Living Space, who are a large construction company, working on the Decent Homes project refurbishing council houses in Sheffield.

For the future Mohammed is now working towards an NVQ level 2 in plastering, which is being funded by his employer and will give him yet another skill to add to his growing portfolio.

Women In Non-Traditional Trades

ver the last three years, trades women and students at the Women's Construction Centre in Burngreave, have helped to transform a former derelict building into a thriving training workshop in construction skills for women.

The project, which is based at premises it shares with the Hindu Temple and Cultural Centre on Buckenham Street aims to enable women to develop their skills in non-traditional trades which could then lead to employment. The project also supports women in finding placements, work experience and provides information on further training at colleges.

The centre, which previously lay derelict for 11 years provides introductory training courses in plastering, tilling, bricklaying, electrics, plumbing, dry stone walling, painting, decorating and computer-aided design. The project also delivers DIY courses in community venues across South Yorkshire and provides construction courses for school girls in years 10 and 11 and also holds 'taster' days in schools.

Rima Wadha, (pictured above right) said: "I started on a course at the South Yorkshire Women's Development Trust (SYWDT) and have progressed onto the furniture making course at Sheffield College. As well as learning new skills the course has given me the opportunity to make new friends. It also makes me feel more independent."

Another learner, Donna Frater (pictured right) said: "I really hated school & I didn't think I would ever learn anything again! Since finding out about the Women's Construction Centre I have done DIY, Tiling, Painting & Decorating, Plastering and Electrics classes and I am now doing a Maths class to help me progress in these subjects. I'm really enjoying learning — I never thought I'd hear myself say that!"

This may be a springboard to a brighter and better future as some participants went on to other active citizenship courses such as 'Confidence in Public Speaking' and 'Politics and Public life.'

This free course is running again for women in the area in the New Year. The WEA is hoping to arrange a trip to London, to the Houses



of Parliament, for those on this course and the Politics and Public Life course. All women in the area are welcome to join.

he British Trust for Conservation Volunteers (BTCV) is a national charity that was set up in 1959 to help with Environmental Conservation.

The local BTCV office is based at Bessemer House on Carlisle Street East, and offers a variety of courses in Environmental Conservation including Land – Based Operations and NVQ Level 2 in Environmental Conservation (See page 12).

The courses feature activities including dry stone walling, fencing, hedge laying, tree planting / felling and habitat management and surveying.

As the training can be physically demanding, students have often remarked on how their fitness levels have improved during their course. The participants also get the opportunity to work in a fantastic environment – the Peak District National Park – which most local residents do not get the chance to experience.

With this programme, as the work is real and hands-on, there is a great sense of achievement as your work has a positive benefit to the environment, you get the opportunity to improve your own health and you can also add some qualifications towards your own personal development.

Want To Improve Your Maths?

he Burngreave Vestry Hall will be running a Maths class every Wednesday afternoon from 1pm - 3pm starting from Wednesday 14th January 2009.

"I am really enjoying this course. I learn new things every week and it keeps my brain active. Most importantly the Maths skills I am learning help me to support my children with their Maths homework."
