
New Primary School

A New Primary School for Fir Vale

The rising population means that more primary school places are needed in your area so we can offer families a local primary school place. On the 21st November Sheffield City Council's Cabinet agreed to build two new primary schools in the North East of the city. One in Fir Vale (see map) and another in the Shirecliffe/ Southey area.

Each school will offer 60 places in each year group, so will be the same size as the other local schools, and will open in September 2014.

Primary schools in your area

The Burngreave and Fir Vale area currently has six primary schools serving the local community: Byron Wood, Firs Hill, Hucklow, Owler Brook, Pye Bank, St Catherine's, and Whiteways. We would expect the new school to work just as hard as all the existing local schools to support local families and help every child reach their potential.

What happens now?

There have been recent changes to the process the Council must follow when opening a new school. The Council must invite expressions of interest from groups who may have an interest in running the school as an academy. We would then pass all expressions of interest on to the Secretary of State for Education to decide who will run the school. The Council can make its own views known to the Secretary of State to help that decision.

The Council has set a deadline of 21st January 2013 to receive expressions of interest. Whilst that is happening we would like to take the opportunity to talk to local parents and the wider community about the new schools. We would like to hear what qualities you would want from the provider of a new school. We also want to know how you would like to see the school and its site used by the wider community in years to come. Over the page are details of how you can get involved in the discussion and the next steps.

- What are the most important qualities you want from the provider of the new school?
- What community involvement and services would you like to see in the new school?

Some questions answered

Will my catchment area change? How will admissions to the new school work?

The Council will ask any organisation interested in running the school to sign up to the Sheffield admissions policy. You can let us know your views on the admissions policy as part of this discussion and any changes were proposed, such as the current catchment areas, this would be subject to local consultation.

How does the new school fit with wider regeneration plans?

The new school will be a key community building. The part of the site bordering the Earl Marshall housing site will not form part of the school. There will be an ongoing community discussion looking at links to the Earl Marshall site and wider community aspirations for local facilities. We will be happy to listen to your views on this as well as the new schools.
