If you would like to pay for one to be installed during the proposed works - or if you currently have an unauthorised vehicle crossing - please apply for one within three weeks of receiving this leaflet.



# Important information about roadworks on your street

#### Streets Ahead Works - B22 Wincobank

Streets Ahead is a huge city-wide highway maintenance project that will bring up to standard the condition of our city's roads, pavements, street lighting, bridges and street-scene.

We are due to start work in your area in **January 2014**. The works will include some (or all) of the following, depending on what is required:

- Gully repairs and clearance
- Pavement and kerb works
- Road resurfacing

- Upgrading the street lights
- Tree maintenance and replacement
- Upgrading traffic signs

#### More about street lights

The new lighting columns may be put in different places to the existing ones. This is to make sure the road is lit most effectively. To keep pavements clear, the columns will be positioned at the back of the pavement where possible. The positions of the new street lights are marked with white paint so you can see where they will be. Not all streets will need new street lighting columns - your street may just get new lanterns.

The work is undertaken in 4 stages:

- Installing the new column;
- Connecting the new column to the electricity mains;
- Removing the old column; and
- Reinstating the pavement.

Please note that there will be a gap in between the stages while the electrical connections are co-ordinated.

### More about road resurfacing

Road resurfacing in the area is due to start in **March 2014**, it is some of the most important work we will do but is also some of the most disruptive. We often upgrade the condition of the main roads and local roads in an area at different times, this is to minimise the disruption in the area.

We will write to you if there are plans for road resurfacing on the street you live or work on. This information will be sent about two weeks before the work starts.

#### Parking and road closures during the works

Parking restrictions and road closures will often be in place whilst we carry out the work. Please make sure to look out for the signs.

On narrow streets we often need to close the road to complete
